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## Research Project *Young and 'care-full'*: The support needs of young kinship carers and children

Progress report October 2017

### Interviews

Thirty-five interviews of young kinship carers have been completed (plus 2 more completed but subsequently deemed out of scope).

Seven interviews have been conducted with young people in or ex kinship care with a young carer. We would prefer to have a total of 10 young people interviews for a better representation of this perspective.

Dr Margaret Kertesz, Research Fellow, and I have commenced coding of transcripts for analysis.

### Census data

Detailed customised tables derived from census data have been received from the Australian Bureau of Statistics and are being analysed.

### Survey

Despite multiple avenues of publicity, there have been few survey responses, and the survey is now closed. In hindsight it appears that this may have been an inappropriate research method to reach such a hidden population.

### Pilot support service

This component of the research project has proved challenging. The initiative has failed to progress with two large child welfare organisation who expressed interest in sponsoring the pilot service. A further Expression of Interest has been received and will be considered in November. The service proposal includes a consulting role for myself across the pilot period, potentially enabling the establishment work to continue into 2018.
