Methods



220 physiotherapists from Australia & New Zealand



Online survey: how physiotherapists diagnose and treat a hypothetical patient (George)



Participants received a 2-part case vignette - 1) patient history and 2) physical examination - of George's hip problem, including NICE criteria for OA.

Diagnosis



64% (141) **diagnosed** hip pain

49% (69) as hip **OA**

96% somewhat confident or more with diagnosis



After physical exam

85% (171) **diagnosed** hip pain

52% (93) as **hip OA**

93% similarly confident in diagnosis as after patient history

Treatments offered



99% Advice and education



98% Exercise and physical activity prescription



. 76% Manual therapy
